Introduction

P Our theme tonight, "The Wonders of His Love," centers on the concept of God's love. The Bible defines this love, declaring, "God is love," and reveals in 1 John 4:9 that "this is how God's love for us was revealed: God has sent his only-begotten Son into the world so that we

may live through him." But who is this God who embodies love? Scripture reveals Him as One, as expressed in Deuteronomy 6:4: "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one." Within this oneness, however, are three distinct Persons, as shown in Matthew 28:19: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." This one God in three persons is the teaching of the Trinity. Tonight, we will explore the wonders of this triune God's love for us.

I. The Wonders of the Father's Love

(Sawyer) The Bible reveals how all things came into existence by the creative power of God:

(Wyatt) Genesis 1:1, "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."

(Brianna) Included in that creation were the first human beings: (Reagan) *Genesis 1:27, "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them."*

(Lawson) And that creation extends down to us today: (Solomon) *Psalm 139:14*, "I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well."

(Elly) At the close of His six-day creation, God made this observation:

(Theo) Genesis 1:31, "And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day."


(Marshal) But into this perfect world came sin, and with sin, death:

(Isaac) Romans 5:12, "Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned."

(Peyton) Psalm 14:2-3, "The Lord looks down from heaven on the children of man, to see if there are any who understand, who seek after God. They have all turned aside; together they have become corrupt; there is none who does good, not even one."

(Sophie) However, the wonders of the Father's love in creation went a step further for the sinners of the world:

(Virginia) Genesis 3:15, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."



(Jonah) God gave reminders of this promised Savior:

(Addy) *Micah 5:2, But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days.*

(Allie) Isaiah 7:14b, Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

(Gabi) Isaiah 53:4-5, Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

(Morgan) This gift would be for all sinners:

(Avary) John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

(PK-8) Give thanks to the Father for the wonders of His love!

II. The Wonders of the Son's Love

(Isaac) When the time was right, the Father sent His Son: (Avary) *Galatians 4:4-5, "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons."*

(Morgan) The details of the Father's gift are given in Luke 2:1-14: (1-8) "And it came to pass in those days that a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This census first took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. 3 So all went to be registered, everyone to his own city. 4 Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, 5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with child. 6 So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered. 7 And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.



"Away in a Manger"

- (PK-2) Away in a manger, no crib for a bed,
 The little Lord Jesus laid down His sweet head.
 The stars in the bright sky looked down where He lay,
 The little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

- (K) 10 Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. 11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. 12 And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger.
- (PK) 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying:
- (PK-8) 14 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men!'"

- (2-8) Shepherds, watching flocks by night in the fields nearby, See an angel in great light! Glory fills the sky!

- (2-8) Hear the angels share the news, tidings of great joy; "Now a Savior comes to you, in this Baby Boy."

(Gabi) Jesus lived His entire life without sin. The wonders of His love eventually led Him to the cross for us.

(Allie) Romans 5:8, "But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

(Virginia) 1 John 3:16a, "By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us."

(Sophie) Our redemption was complete:

Revelation 1:5b-6, "To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen."

(PK-8) Give thanks to the Son for the wonders of His love!"

III. The Wonders of the Spirit's Love

(Addy) The gift of salvation through the only Savior from sin and death needs to reach people. It is the Holy Spirit who works to bring us to faith in the love of the Father and the Son.

(Jonah) 1 Corinthians 2:9-10a, "But, as it is written, 'What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him'—these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit."

(Virginia) 1 Corinthians 12:3b, "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except in the Holy Spirit."

(Sophie) This call of the Holy Spirit to faith in Jesus is known as sanctification:

(Peyton) 2 Thessalonians 2:13, "But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth"



(Isaac) Sanctification also includes the work of the Holy Spirit in keeping us in the Christian faith: (Marshal) John 14:26, "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you."

(Theo) To aid in this work of sanctification, the Holy Spirit supplies gifts: (Avary) *Romans 5:5b, "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us."*

(Morgan) Galatians 5:22, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness."

(Gabi) 1 John 4:19, "We love because he first loved us."

(Allie) 1 Corinthians 13:4-7, 13, "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love."

(PK-8) Give thanks to the Spirit for the wonders of His love!
