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

Good Friday Tenebrae



Preparation for Worship: Read Psalm 22 (Lutheran Service Book or Pew Bible) 1

Welcome (Pastor) - Good evening and welcome to our Good Friday Tenebrae service. *Tenebrae* is a Latin term meaning "shadows, darkness." This service is an ancient form of worship dating from the fourth century. During this service the sanctuary is gradually darkened and the seven candles are gradually extinguished to remind us of the three hours of darkness which blanketed the earth during Christ's crucifixion as He suffered the punishment of being forsaken by God for our sins. The darkness of Good Friday prepares us for the brilliant dawning of Jesus resurrection on Easter.

Invocation & Opening Prayer

We invoke ("call upon") the name of the one true God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

- P In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- Amen.
- P Hear my prayer, O LORD;
- let my cry come to You!
- Holy Father, on this day Your Son Jesus carried the burden of our sin to the cross, there to suffer and die for the darkness of our trespasses. Your love for us is so great that You sacrificed Your only Son in our place. He willingly took the guilt, pain, and punishment that we so rightfully deserve. The darkness of His death gives us the light of salvation through faith. For this we give You the praise, honor, and glory due Your most holy name.

Responsive Reading

Isaiah 53 (selected verses - NKJV)

The responsive reading of selected verses of <u>Isaiah 53</u> a prophecy of the suffering and death of Christ Jesus for the sins of all people.

- P He is despised and rejected by men,
- A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief.
- P And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him;
- **1** He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.

- P Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows;
- **Q** Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted.
- P But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities;
- The punishment for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed.
- P All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way;
- And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.
- P He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He opened not His mouth;
- He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, And as a sheep before its shearers is silent, So He opened not His mouth.
- P He was taken from prison and from judgment, And who will declare His generation?
- For He was cut off from the land of the living; For the transgressions of My people He was stricken.
- P And they made His grave with the wicked -- But with the rich at His death,
- **©** Because He had done no violence, Nor was any deceit in His mouth.
- P Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise Him; He has put Him to grief. When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His offspring,
- He shall prolong His days, And the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in His hand.
- P He shall see the labor of His soul, and be satisfied.
- By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, For He shall bear their iniquities.
- P Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the great,
- And He shall divide the spoil with the strong, Because He poured out His soul unto death,
- **P** And He was numbered with the transgressors,
- **a** And He bore the sin of many, And made intercession for the transgressors.

Confession and Absolution

We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.

- P Let us now confess our sins to God our Father.
- Gracious God, You know our frailty. You understand our weakness. You are acquainted with our failures. Though we have professed to believe, we betray our Lord by our actions.




We have refused to bear the troubles of others.

Extinguishing of the second candle.

Confession of Faith: 2nd Article of the Apostle's Creed (Luther's Catechism, Sydow p. 87)

"I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits on the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from there He shall come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary is my Lord.

He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person,



VIII. The Gospel: Mark 15:42-47 – Jesus' Burial (Reader: Erik Nelson)

Extinguishing of the seventh candle.

Benediction The blessing given by God for the blessing of His people (Numbers 6:24-26).

P Go now into the darkness of night. Though we walk in darkness, we are not forsaken. We are led by the hand of God. May the love of God the Father calm your fears.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus keep you through the night.

May the presence of the Holy Spirit sustain you throughout your life.

The Lord bless you and keep you.

The Lord make His face shine on you and be gracious to you.

Amen.
