Ezekiel 34:11-16 (ESV)

¹¹ "For thus says the Lord God: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. ¹² As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³ And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. And I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the ravines, and in all the inhabited places of the country. ¹⁴ I will feed them with good pasture, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing land. ¹⁷ For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd,





Nepal (South Asia) – Pastor Raju recently reported that fiftyseven adults, children, and infants were baptized into Christ during visits to distant congregations during the Easter season. See pictures <u>HERE</u>. Eight CLC Mission Helpers will be visiting Nepal in late June. Plans are to teach the Gospel to approximately 1500 children in twelve different congregations and preaching stations. Fifteen men will finish their Himalayan

Bible Institute studies in the coming months, and their graduation is planned for October or November. Thank the Lord for the gift of Baptism and for the 57 souls who have received this sacrament in Nepal. Ask God to bless all the Mission Helper Trip preparation over the next several weeks. And ask for the Lord's blessings on the last few months of Bible instruction for the HBI students.

Liberia (West Africa) – Due to serious health concerns, Pastor John Hein has resigned his call as the part-time visiting missionary to Liberia. The Board of Missions has assigned visiting, correspondence, and oversight duties to Missionary Ohlmann. Thank the Lord for Pastor Hein's faithful service to his call and for the many blessings experienced by both Pastor Hein and the members of the Liberia-CLC. Ask the Lord to grant patience and wisdom to Missionary Ohlmann and those he will begin working with in Liberia as they make plans to continue the Gospel outreach work.

Kenya (East Africa) – Missionaries Naumann and Ohlmann are planning a visit in May to offer assistance and guidance regarding organizational and leadership issues. While in Kenya, they will be on hand to teach pastoral training lessons and attend the KCLC annual convention. Pray that the Lord grants the necessary wisdom, love, patience, diligence, and clear direction as we seek His blessings for the upcoming meetings, correspondence, and decisions that the leaders of the KCLC, the CLC Kinship Committee, and the CLC Board of Missions need to make.

Nigeria (West Africa) – With an MDF grant and local offerings, the Nigeria-CLC has made good progress in constructing a new multipurpose building for the seminary. When finished, the building will include new classrooms, a library/computer room, and an office for faculty. <u>Recent pictures</u> show the progress. Missionary Ohlmann plans to visit the NCLC in the Fall for the dedication of the building. Ask the Lord to continue to bless this project and thank Him for providing the funding through the NCLC and MDF offerings of CLC members. Thank the Lord for the privilege of working together in this effort to train faithful workers in His Nigerian harvest of souls!

Bangladesh (South Asia) – The BLCM building project began with groundbreaking and foundation work in the week following Easter. <u>Pictures</u> show significant progress. They hope to complete all the foundation work and ground floor slab before the monsoon season begins in the coming weeks. The Board of Missions has sent the first two installments of an MDF grant to help support this project. Plans are to send the remaining funds in three more installments over the next six months to help complete phase one of this project. Additional offerings to the MDF will be needed to complete funding on schedule. This multipurpose building will serve God's Kingdom as a Bible Institute for training faithful church workers, a place for worship, and housing for teachers and students. Fourteen men are ready to begin pastoral training once the building is finished! Continue to pray for the success of this building project and that the Lord would move the hearts of His people to give generously for this important work so that the project can stay on schedule.

DR Congo (Central Africa) – Pastor Lumiangu, who serves the members of the Confessional Lutheran Church of the Family of Saints in Kinshasa, recently lost his rented home to flooding. He is looking for a new home to rent that will not be so susceptible to flooding. Pastor Yumba, who serves the <u>CCLC</u>, reports that the seminary students of Holy Trinity Lutheran Seminary are completing their vicarages. The plans are for graduation and ordination later this year when Missionaries Evensen and Ohlmann visit. Pray that the Lord will provide a suitable home and the resources to pay the additional rent for Pastor Lumiangu and his family. Thank the Lord for the diligent study and faithful teaching of God's Word over the past several years of the Holy Trinity Seminary. Ask for the Lord's continued blessings on the students as they finish their vicarage assignments.

Myanmar (South Asia) – The <u>civil war in Myanmar continues</u> with no end in sight, causing much suffering for our brothers and sisters in Christ. Thankfully, we have been able to provide minimal humanitarian assistance through Kinship. With so much damage done to the infrastructure, consistent electricity is scarce. The orphanage has been relying on a generator for a couple of hours each evening for light and to pump water. The generator is now beyond repair. Kinship has provided a grant to help them purchase a new generator for the orphanage. Please keep our brothers and sisters in your prayers, asking for peace, justice, and relief for all affected by this conflict. Thank the Lord for Providing a new generator through the offerings to Kinship.

Mexico (Latin America) – Pastor Olvera's mother-in-law passed away on April 7th. Pastor Olvera's wife, Claudia, was by her side, providing love and care when the Lord called her to the eternal home He has prepared for her. Thank the Lord for the victory over death our Savior won for us on the cross and through the empty tomb that comforts this family.

Togo (West Africa) – Missionary Evensen reports that three students are in their final year at Mount Horeb Lutheran Seminary, with graduation tentatively scheduled for November. One of the students has started a preaching station in his home and is actively inviting people to attend. Pastor Kossi Blewu has been conducting a Gospel outreach radio program in a town located about 30 minutes away from the seminary. If the Lord blesses this effort to establish a preaching station, one of the graduates from the seminary will be called to serve there. Please pray for these students as they complete their studies and ask the Lord to bless their efforts in establishing preaching stations and congregations so that the truth of His saving word may be proclaimed for the salvation of Togolese souls.

Tanzania (East Africa)—Following the Spring Easter break, all the Wittenberg Lutheran Theological Seminary students have returned to classes. The semester will end in mid-May, and the students will return to their homes until the next semester begins. Ask the Lord to bless these students and the instructors, Missionary Naumann, Pastor Loskira, and Pastor Issangya, in their labors.

The Philippines (Southeast Asia) – Pastor Palangyos has begun remodeling a new worship and Bible training facility that his sister donated to the LAMP. Please pray for the LAMP members' faith and success in their outreach efforts so that more people may repent of their sins and rejoice in the forgiveness of Jesus Christ. Ask the Lord to provide everything necessary to complete the new worship and training facility.

India (South Asia) – Pastor Jyothi and another CLC-India pastor were recently attacked by Hindu Extremists. The other pastor suffered broken facial bones that required hospitalization and surgery. Pastor Jyothi was treated and released. Police reports were filed, but there was no follow-up. Missionary Ohlmann recently applied for a visa to visit India again. His visa was revoked five years ago, and he has not been allowed to visit India since. Pray that the Lord will protect, support, and strengthen the faith of His children in India amid increased persecution against Christians. Ask the Lord to provide a visa for Missionary Ohlmann if it is His will to visit India again.

Missionary Peter Evensen (Togo, West Africa) – Missionary Evensen continues his teaching duties at Mt. Horeb Lutheran Seminary and also teaches at the local congregation in Lomé. Thank the Lord for the work Missionary Evensen is doing, and pray for his improved health. He will be returning to the U.S. for furlough in June.

Missionary Bruce Naumann (Tanzania-East Africa) – Missionary Naumann will meet Missionary Ohlmann in Nairobi on May 17th. They will spend about a week meeting with the pastors and leaders of the KCLC and the two kinship-supported schools in Etago and Moi's Bridge. Paula will be returning to the U.S. for furlough on May 14th. Missionary Naumann will join her a few weeks later. You can follow Missionary Naumann's blog at <u>https://clc-tz.blogspot.com/</u>. Praise the Lord for all that Missionary Naumann is accomplishing, thank the Lord for the faithful support and encouragement of his wife Paula, and ask our Savior to grant wisdom, patience, love, and all that is necessary to continue our Savior's work in East Africa.

Missionary Todd Ohlmann – Missionary Ohlmann was forced to postpone his visit to Nigeria due to issues in obtaining a visa. Those issues have been resolved; he received his visa a few weeks ago. He will meet Missionary Naumann in Kenya in the second week of May. He will lead the Mission Helper Trip to Nepal in June. He has also been assisting with the pastoral vacancy at Faith Lutheran Church in the St. Louis area. Please pray that the Lord blesses and provides for all the necessary preparations for these trips to occur.
