


Confession and Absolution

- **P** The second reading is from Romans 3:19-28.
- **©** Sanctify us by Your truth, O LORD. Your Word is truth!


²¹ But now, completely apart from the law, a righteousness from God has been made known. The Law and the Prophets testify to it. ²² This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all and over all who believe.

In fact, there is no difference, ²³ because all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God ²⁴ and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God publicly displayed as the atonement seat through faith in his blood. God did this to demonstrate his justice, since, in his divine restraint, he had left the sins that were committed earlier unpunished. ²⁶ He did this to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so that he would be both just and the one who justifies the person who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷ What happens to boasting then? It has been eliminated. By what principle—by the principle of works? No, but by the principle of faith. ²⁸ For we conclude that a person is justified by faith without the works of the law.

P Here ends our Scripture readings.

¹⁹ Now we know that whatever the law says is addressed to those who are under the law, so that every mouth will be silenced and the whole world will be subject to God's judgment. ²⁰ For this reason, no one will be declared righteous in his sight by works of the law, for through the law we become aware of sin.



Confession of Faith - 2nd Article of the Apostles' Creed Luther's Catechism (Sydow, p. 87)

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits on the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from there He shall come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary is my Lord.

He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sin, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and His innocent suffering and death.

He did this that I should be His very own, live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in eternal righteousness, innocence, and joy; just as He is risen from death, lives and reigns in eternity. This is most certainly true!

How can you say, 'You will be set free'?" ³⁴ Jesus answered, "Amen, Amen, I tell you: Everyone who keeps committing sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵ But a slave does not remain in the family forever. A son does remain forever. ³⁶ So if the Son sets you free, you really will be free.







The Board of Elders has been given the task of surveying the congregation, to be completed before the January quarterly meeting (See Voters' Meeting Minutes Summary on next page).

Quarterly Voters' Meeting Minutes Summary from Last Sunday's Meeting – 10/19/25

Membership

- a. A motion was called, seconded, and carried to accept the transfer of Austin Williams from Messiah Lutheran Church, Eau Claire.
- b. Call for new voting members: a motion was called, seconded, and carried to accept Austin Williams as a voting member.

Reports

c. Trustees

- i. Caleb Gerbitz extended thanks to the Board of Property for their work responding to recent flooding at the parsonage.
- ii. Caleb advised that the maximum expense which the council can authorize is currently undefined, and stated that the council will work to bring a recommended spending cap for approval at the January quarterly meeting.

d. Pastor

i. Pastor Luke provided a written report and reviewed.

e. Treasurer

- i. Joel Gerbitz provided a written report and reviewed.
 - 1. Amendment made to General Fund offerings on page 1: General Fund offerings amount was \$108,055 instead of \$109,230.
- ii. Joel noted that the total cost of parsonage repairs was around \$2,400, lower than anticipated.
- iii. A question was asked about the positive balance shown in the Messiah Student Aid Fund. Joel clarified that the balance shown will be disbursed.
- iv. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept the treasurer's report as amended, subject to audit.

f. Board of Elders

i. Ted Quade provided a written report and reviewed.

g. Board of Education

- i. Ben Blue provided a written report and reviewed.
- ii. A question was asked on the cause of the false fire alarm mentioned in the report. Jim Lisak advised that it was likely triggered by plumbing soldering smoke and will probably not be an issue in the future.

h. Board of Property

- i. Fred Goodrie provided a written report and reviewed.
- ii. A question was asked regarding the parsonage sump pump and how to prevent basement floods in the future. Jim noted that drainage improvements were added to the parsonage in the past and the recent

- flooding in this case was due to the excessive rainfall rather than a problem with the pump. Jim also noted that the parsonage previously had a generator which was not maintained.
- iii. Jordan Albrecht noted that the board received a quote for repair of the church furnace, which will likely exceed the cost of replacement.

Unfinished Business

- i. Post-service ushering
 - i. A motion was called and seconded to adopt the board of elders' recommendation to return to post-service ushering beginning at the November 2 service. The motion was defeated, 13 in favor and 15 opposed.
 - ii. A motion was called and seconded to extend the trial period until the next quarterly meeting, with an opinion survey of the entire congregation to be completed during that period.
 - Adam Brown moved an amendment to the motion to charge the task of surveying the congregation to the board of elders, to be completed before the January quarterly meeting. The motion for the amendment was seconded and carried.
 - 2. The motion to extend the trial period was called and carried.

New Business

- Church calendar: a motion to approve the 2026 calendar was called, seconded, and carried.
- k. Parsonage basement repairs
 - i. A motion to ratify the council's authorization of the board of property to purchase materials for the parsonage basement repair was called, seconded, and carried.
 - ii. Caleb Gerbitz noted that the expense was paid from the Reserve for Major Projects fund.
- I. Financial audit volunteers: Caleb noted that one person has volunteered to assist with the audit, and a second volunteer is still needed.
