#### Invocation

#### **Confession and Absolution**

We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.

- P On this day of thanks we come into the presence of God, who created us to love and serve Him as His dear children. We come to offer Him our thanks and praise for all His goodness. But we have disobeyed Him. We do not deserve to come before His holy presence. We deserve only His wrath and punishment. Therefore, let us confess our sins to Him and plead for His mercy.
- Merciful Father in heaven, I am altogether sinful by nature. In countless ways I have sinned against You and do not deserve to be called Your child. But trusting in Jesus, my Savior, I pray: Have mercy upon me according to Your unfailing love. Cleanse me from my sin, and take away my guilt.
- God our heavenly Father, has forgiven all your sins. By the perfect life and innocent death of our Lord Jesus Christ, He has removed your guilt forever. You are His own dear child. Give thanks to Him for He truly has "blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ!" (Ephesians 1:3). In the joy and peace of forgiveness let us now praise the Lord:

- P Make haste, O God, to deliver me;
- Make haste, to help me, O Lord!

P We pray:



# **Sermon: "A Thanksgiving Poem of Praise"**

Texts: Psalm 103; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18; Job 1:21; Philippians 4:4-7

#### Psalm 103 (selected verses – RESPONSIVE) (ESV)

- P Bless the LORD, O my soul,
- and all that is within me, bless his holy name!

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#### Job 1:21 (NKJV)

And [Job] said: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, And naked shall I return there. The LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; Blessed be the name of the LORD."

But what about those days and times When things don't go our way? When we don't feel like giving thanks, When tears won't keep at bay.

So as we hear these words again, Words heard at sermon's end, Remember why we can "Rejoice!" For Jesus calls you, "Friend!"


# Philippians 4:4-7 (EHV)


