
Confession and Absolution

First Reading - *Romans 6:1-10 (EHV)*

“What Does Your Baptism Mean?”

What shall we say then? Shall we keep on sinning so that grace may increase?² Absolutely not! We died to sin. How can we go on living in it any longer?³ Or do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?⁴ We were therefore buried with him by this baptism into his death, so that just as he was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too would also walk in a new life.

⁵ For if we have been united with him in the likeness of his death, we will certainly also be united with him in the likeness of his resurrection.

⁶ We know that our old self was crucified with him, to make our sinful body powerless, so that we would not continue to serve sin. ⁷ For the person who has died has been declared free from sin. ⁸ And since we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹ We know that since Christ has been raised from the dead, he will never die again. Death no longer has control over him. ¹⁰ For the death he died, he died to sin once and for all, but the life he lives, he lives to God.

P The Gospel reading is from Matthew 3:13-17.



I am well pleased with him."

Sermon Text: Mark 9:2-10 (EHV)

² After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John with him and led them up a high mountain where they were alone by themselves. There he was transfigured in front of them. ³ His clothes became radiant, dazzling white, whiter than anyone on earth could bleach them. ⁴ And Elijah appeared to them together with Moses, and they were talking with Jesus. ⁵ Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." ⁶ He did not know what to say because they were terrified. ⁷ A cloud appeared and overshadowed them, and a voice came from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love. 

The activity committee is setting out some baked goods/breakfast finger foods to be shared following the service today in celebration of **Baptism Sunday (2/15)**. Please join us immediately following the worship service.



Piano Replacement Fund – The Lord has blessed our congregation with two digital pianos that have been in operation for more than 25 years. However, both pianos are nearing the end of their service lives, and the piano in the Activity Room has begun to fail. After speaking with a technician, it was determined that it is not feasible to repair the existing piano. A specially appointed Piano Committee has begun researching replacement options and determined it will likely cost \$6,000 to replace a single piano. During the January Voters Meeting, the Voters created a special Piano Replacement Fund to begin saving to replace one or both of the congregation's pianos. Members who would like to contribute to the special fund are encouraged to write "**Piano Fund**" on their offering envelopes.

UPDATE: One of our families has generously offered to pay for the replacement of the piano in the Activity Room. Praise God for moving the hearts of His people to such generosity! Once the new piano is purchased the piano in the church sanctuary will be moved to the Activity Room. Donations toward the Piano Fund will now go towards replacement of the piano that is currently in the church sanctuary.





Ash Wednesday Worship with Communion / Lent Begins – This Wednesday 2/18 @ 6:30pm



Please make plans to join us for our Wednesday Lent worship services beginning with a communion service on **Ash Wednesday, Feb. 18th at 6:30pm**. The theme of our Wednesday Lent series this year is **“Return to the Lord.”** The theme comes from Joel 2:13 “Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster” (Joel 2:13). God’s invitation and promise finds its fullness in Jesus Christ, who personifies and accomplishes all that God declares. During this season of Lent, we will consider this theme “Return to the Lord,” and

examine how the call to return played out in practical ways for the people who walked alongside Christ as He demonstrated and carried out God’s grace and mercy on our behalf, taking God’s wrath upon Himself, setting the stage for God to “turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind Him” (Joel 2:14). Each sermon in this series focuses on a particular event in the Passion, with a special focus on the people involved in the event. We pray that by studying the events and people of various parts of Jesus’ Passion this helps us to see how we too have turned away from the Lord, and to reinforce and rejoice in God’s call for us to return to Him with all our heart.
