SCRIPTURE READINGS

God speaks to us.

First Reading

Genesis 1:26-28, 2:15-25 (EHV)

^{1:26} God said, "Let us make man in our image, according to our likeness, and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the sky, and over the livestock, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that crawls on the earth."

²⁷ God created the man in his own image. In the image of God he created him. Male and female he created them.

²⁸ God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful, multiply, fill the earth, and subdue it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the sky, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

... ^{2:15} The Lord God took the man and settled him in the Garden of Eden to work it and to take care of it. ¹⁶ The Lord God gave a command to the man. He said, "You may freely eat from every tree in the garden, ¹⁷ but you shall not eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, for on the day that you eat from it, you will certainly die."

¹⁸ The Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper who is a suitable partner for him." ¹⁹ Out of the soil the Lord God had formed every wild animal and every bird of the sky, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them. Whatever the man called every living creature, that became its name. ²⁰ The man gave names to all the livestock, and to the birds of the sky, and to every wild animal, but for Adam no helper was found who was a suitable partner for him. ²¹ The Lord God

caused the man to fall into a deep sleep. As the man slept, the Lord God took a rib and closed up the flesh where it had been.²² The Lord God built a woman from the rib that he had taken from the man and brought her to the man.

²³ The man said, Now this one is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh. She will be called “woman,” because she was taken out of man.

²⁴ For this reason a man will leave his father and his mother and will remain united with his wife, and they will become one flesh.

²⁵ They were both naked, the man and his wife, and they were not ashamed.

Gospel Reading

Romans 5:12-18 (EHV)

¹² So then, just as sin entered the world through one man and death through sin, so also death spread to all people because all sinned.¹³ For even before the law was given, sin was in the world. Now, sin is not charged to one’s account if there is no law,¹⁴ and yet death reigned from the time of Adam to the time of Moses, even over those whose sin was not like the transgression of Adam, who is a pattern of the one who was to come.

¹⁵ But the gracious gift is not like Adam’s trespass. For if the many died by the trespass of this one man, it is even more certain that God’s grace, and the gift given by the grace of the one man Jesus Christ, overflowed to the many!

¹⁶ And the gift is not like the effect of the one man’s sin, for the judgment that followed the one trespass resulted in a verdict of condemnation, but the gracious gift that followed many trespasses resulted in a verdict of justification.

¹⁷ Indeed, if by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through the one man, it is even more certain that those who receive the overflowing grace of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ!

¹⁸ So then, just as one trespass led to a verdict of condemnation for all people, so also one righteous verdict led to life-giving justification for all people.

Children's Sermon - *Children 10 years old and younger are invited to come up front.*

Sermon Text: Genesis 3:1-15 (EHV)

Now the serpent was more clever than any wild animal which the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Has God really said, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden?'"

² The woman said to the serpent, “We may eat fruit from the trees of the garden, ³ but not from the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden. God has said, ‘You shall not eat from it. You shall not touch it, or else you will die.’”

⁴ The serpent said to the woman, “You certainly will not die. ⁵ In fact, God knows that the day you eat from it, your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”

⁶ When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was appealing to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise, she took some of its fruit and ate. 

Please make plans to join us for our **Wednesday Lent** worship services **at 6:30pm**. The theme of our Wednesday Lent series this year is **“Return to the Lord.”** The theme comes from Joel 2:13 “Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster” (Joel 2:13). God’s invitation and promise finds its fullness in Jesus Christ, who personifies and accomplishes all that God declares. Messiah Church Council Meeting Summary (2/19)

1. Reports

- a. Pastor
 - With the help of Principal Tiefel the Livestream links, bulletin link, and "Helpful Links" for members have been updated in the emails sent with the sermon each Sunday (and Wednesday during Lent and Advent). Members can click on these links and will be taken directly to the website or file connected to it.
- b. Treasurer
 - Joel Gerbitz clarified that the fees for online giving are usually deducted from an individual's contribution rather than added to the contribution amount.
- c. Board of Elders
 - Ted Quade clarified that the elders are awaiting responses to delinquency letters by April 1 before discussing further steps. Four such letters have been sent to delinquent members.

2. Old Business

- a. Council spending authority policy: Caleb Gerbitz has not received feedback on the proposed bylaw since presenting it to the voters at the recent quarterly meeting.
- b. Piano replacement: The church piano replacement will be covered by a donation from a member family. Voter approval is not required for the purchase, and the piano committee will be directed to proceed with purchasing a new instrument.

3. New Business

- a. Filing of financial records
 - Joel Gerbitz advised that the council should maintain a filing system for important financial documents independent of ChurchTrac, as ChurchTrac may not always be available as an external storage solution.
 - Joel will use the existing Trustees shared drive to organize financial records. Generally, financial documents older than eight years should be deleted.
- b. Financial reporting in the bulletin
 - The current weekly reporting structure for church finances has been observed to be misleading, as online giving is totaled every two weeks and many families give offerings on a biweekly or monthly basis.
 - Joel Gerbitz proposed that financial reports be printed in the bulletin only on the second Sunday of every month, to allow time for compiling the previous month's data and to even out apparent fluctuations.
 - Joel will present a motion to be brought to the voters at the next council meeting.

General Fund – The positive balance in the General Fund increased slightly this month and now sits at about \$16,000, which is \$20,000 ahead of last year.

ILC Operations – January, the first month of the second semester at ILC, is generally a good month for revenue and this year is no exception. Revenues were about \$50,000 more than disbursements, increasing the ending balance by that amount.

Kinship – Contributions continue to be strong and are up 54% over the same period last year.

Church Extension Fund – Year to date revenue consists of regular monthly payments received from congregations on loans they owe the CLC and a lump-sum payoff of one loan for a total of about \$347,000. Revenue also includes \$167,000 from increases in the market value of the investments. Disbursements include \$559,000 loaned to a member congregation for their building project.

EduK8 Fund – Another \$10,000 was disbursed in January to assist one of our Christian day schools.

Other Auxiliary Funds – The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.
